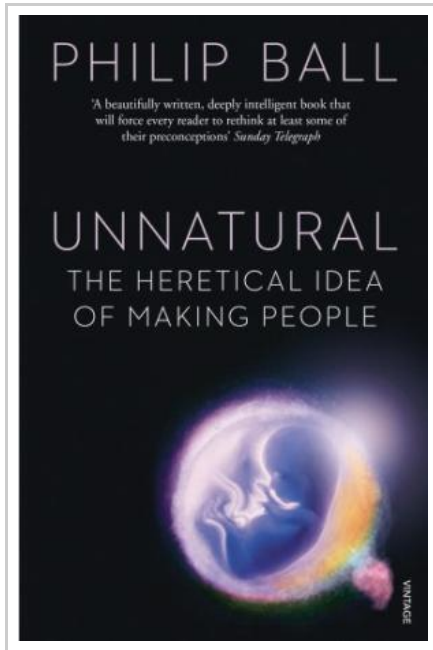




Unnatural: The Heretical Idea of Making People
